ADMISSION POLICY

TO THE APPLICANT: (Please read before completing the application)

All Building Trades Apprenticeship Programs are five (5) year in duration with a typical workday starting at 7:00 a.m. The WDW program is four (4) years in duration and is on a shift work schedule.

All programs are registered with the State of Florida and approved under the G. I Bill. The only cost to the apprentice is for the purchase of textbooks, which is approximately \$100.00 to \$200.00 a year. **These fees are due before the end of the first week of class each year.**

Applications for entry into these programs are accepted from June 1st through May 31st each year.

Applications are accepted without regard to race, religion, sex or national origin. All applicants must be eighteen (18) years of age or older and must have a high school diploma or earned their GED. The Joint Apprenticeship Committee holds oral interviews for all programs on an as needed basis.

- All applications must be completed and include a certified copy of your high school transcripts or GED scores as well as a copy of your driver's license before your application can be processed.
- All applicants are required to pay a \$40.00 application fee and complete an entrance exam prior to being interviewed for the program.

In person interviews for consideration of acceptance into the program will take place in June or July each year. If one is accepted into the program, they will be required to attend an orientation in June or July with training beginning in August.

Please print all information on your application. Make sure your telephone number and address are correct. If you move at any time, you will need to provide the JATC office with the updated address. Be sure to sign the application at the required spaces.

If you are accepted into one of these programs, the following rules shall be always adhered to:

- 1. There will be no alcoholic beverages or un-prescribed drugs allowed on the school premises at any time unless approved by the Joint Apprenticeship Committee or Training Director.
- 2. You shall attend related classes six (6) hours per week, as scheduled by the Training Director. The only excused absences shall be those covered by a Doctors' Certificate or a death in the immediate family. Any other may be cause for dismissal.
- 3. You shall maintain a passing grade average or be dismissed from the program.
- 4. You must attend work on time. If you are fired or quit your job, you will not be placed on another job without Joint Apprenticeship Committee approval.
- 5. Purchase of books is the responsibility of the apprentice. Books will be issued as needed and must be paid for prior to the end of January of your training year.
